Since the FBI established IC3 (Internet Crime Complaint Center) in 2000, they've received 8 million complaints.¹ The latest report shows another alarming increase in cybercrime in the U.S. in 2023.

Cybercrime on the rise

28 seconds

In 2023, a cyber crime was reported once every 28 seconds.



\$12.5B losses

Total cyber crime losses in 2023 reached \$12.5B.

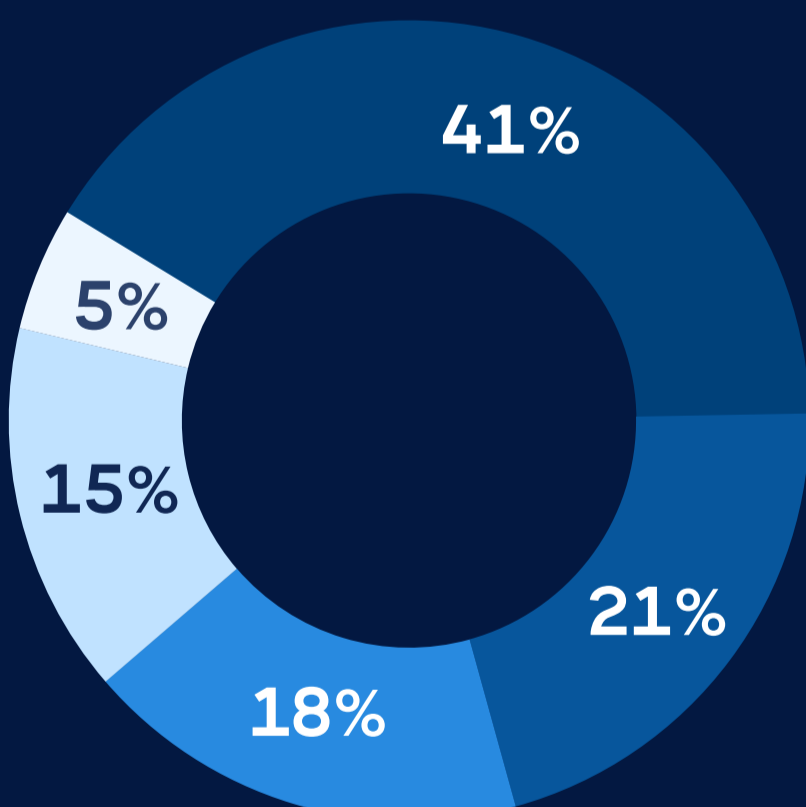
